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## FIXED POINT THEOREMS IN GENERALISED CONE METRIC SPACES

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## 1. Introduction and Definitions

Huang and Zhang [7] proposed the idea of cone metric space. They define cone metric space and order Banach space in lieu of real numbers in this study. The Banach contraction principle is an important technique for determining the existence of solutions to mathematical models of real-world situations including functional, differential, integral, matrix, and other forms of equations.
